

COASTAL CAROLINA UNIVERSITY TEACHING FELLOWS

OVERVIEW

The Coastal Carolina University Teaching Fellows program is designed to offer students a unique, coordinated, and collaborative opportunity to become teacher-leaders. Fellows participate in a number of professional development opportunities including learning seminars, workshops, conferences, action research, service learning, and leadership training. Their work is supported by a program director who oversees the Teaching Fellows program at CCU. Administered by the Center for Educator Recruitment, Retention, and Advancement (CERRA), the program provides \$24,000 scholarships/loans over four years for up to 200 outstanding high school seniors. Coastal Carolina University is one of 11 institutions in the state identified as a Teaching Fellow Institution.

OPPORTUNITIES

COMMITTEES: Coastal Carolina University's Teaching Fellows segments program members into nine committees which include: Social/Food Committee; Social Media/Communication Committee; Fundraising Committee; Professional Development Committee; Welcome Week/College Transition Committee; Executive Committee; Community Outreach Committee; Expectations and Attendance Committee; and Legislature Updates Committee. The fellows collaborate to execute goals of their respective committee.

TRUNK O' TREAT: This is a fundraising event that is hosted by the Student-South Carolina Education Association in collaboration with CCU Teaching Fellows and the Call Me Mister programs. This event invites the public to join the Coastal Carolina University community in trick-or-treating from decorated vehicles. Student organizations and campus departments are encouraged to participate. This event raises funds to support local Horry County public schools.

MOCK INTERVIEW DAY: Coastal Carolina University Teaching Fellows plan and host a Mock Interview Day for any incoming freshmen that have been chosen by CERRA to attend Regional Interview Day. The Teaching Fellows work together to create the best possible interview experience that is similar to the real thing. The freshmen will receive feedback provided by current fellows, Spadoni College of Education professional staff, and CCU Teaching Fellows advisory board members.

UNIVERSITY 110: CCU requires all incoming freshmen to take a course that allows them to get to know the campus. Within this course, the Teaching Fellows have a separate class taught by the academic adviser of the program. The program also offers additional classes taught by the director, assistant director, and professional staff members of the Spadoni College of Education, which fellows take after passing UNIV 110. These courses are TFP 102, 201, 202, and 301.

FIELD EXPERIENCE: Teaching Fellows begin classroom placement experiences their freshmen year and continue with different school placements their sophomore year. In comparison to other education majors, fellows spend more time in the classroom before the start of their junior year.
