### How do I become a South Carolina Teaching Fellow?

The mission of the Teaching Fellows Program administered by CERRA (Center for Teacher Recruitment, Retention, and Advancement) is to recruit talented high school seniors into the teaching profession and help them develop leadership qualities.

Teaching Fellows receive up to \$24,000 in fellowship funds (up to \$6,000 a year for four years) while completing a degree leading to initial teacher certification. With \$5,700 for tuition and board and \$300 for specific enrichment programs, Fellows agree to teach in a South Carolina public school one year for every year they receive the Fellowship.
