

CERRA Teaching Fellows

The Teaching Fellows Program recruits talented high school seniors into the teaching profession and helps them develop leadership qualities to make a difference in public school education in South Carolina.

Anderson University is one of eleven Teaching Fellows Institutions throughout the state, accepting Teaching Fellows.

Fellows agree to teach in a South Carolina public school one year for every year they receive the Fellowship, which can be up to \$5,700 yearly for tuition and board and \$300 for specific enrichment programs administered by CERRA (Center for Educator Recruitment, Retentions, & Advancement).


Students must apply for Teaching Fellows during their final year of high school. The application submission window is open from October 1st until December 1st, 11:59pm. <https://www.cerra.org/teaching-fellowsapplication.html>

Financial Aid

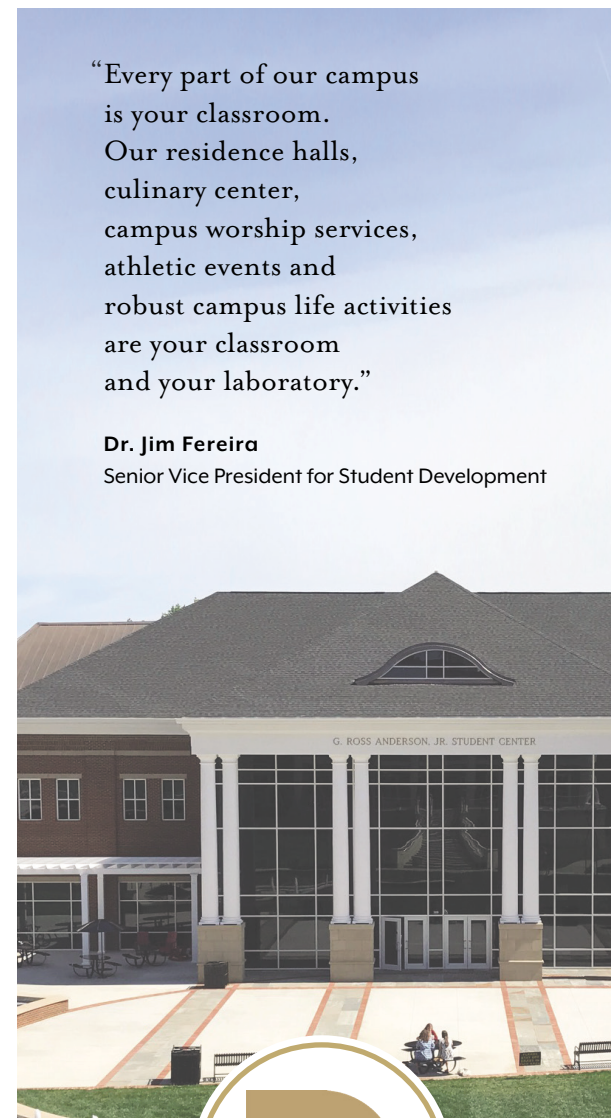
