Michael Hyatt's Your Best Year Ever: A 5-Step Plan for Achieving Your Most Important Goals

Creating the best year ever means understanding certain assumptions about yourself.

The truth is that reaching a goal does not make us happy; it makes us move the goalpost of success. Neuroscience and psychology have both proven that the relationship between success and happiness works in the opposite way. Happiness is the precursor to success, not the result. Happiness and optimism lead to improved performance and greater achievement.
