Introduction

Since 2001, CERRA has administered South Carolina's Annual Educator Supply and Demand Survey to all public school districts (traditional and charter districts) in the state. The survey, which collects information on teachers entering the profession, movers and leavers, and positions that remain vacant, is emailed to district personnel directors at the beginning of each school year. They have the full month of September to complete the survey. It is important to note that in this survey, districts are asked to report on classroom teachers as well as school counselors, school librarians, school psychologists, and speech language pathologists.

Once surveys are submitted, the data are analyzed and summarized into a statewide report that can be found at <u>https://www.cerra.org/supply-and-demand.html</u>. This report is now a two-page white paper highlighting key data points through visuals and bulleted text. The following tables include raw data that were collected from 72 of 73 public school districts and two public charter school districts in the state for a total of 74 survey respondents. District representatives were asked to report data in full-time equivalents (FTEs) to account for full-time and part-time positions.
